



The news about East of Eden is that a remake is in the works and this one explores the depths of depravity of Adam Trask's wife, Cathy Ames. You don't get a sense of it in the earlier films, but in the book, she's not the hooker with the heart of gold but the downright incarnation of evil. I don't like "dark" movies, but to be true to the book this new one will necessarily have to be. Jim"

The Wayback Machine has more than one gear, so this week we're going back in time as per usual, then ahead to 2014 or thereabouts. It's a pretty nifty trick if I can pull it off, so buckle up.

It was 1955.....

I was 7 going on 8 and one night my folks bundled me up and took me to the Alisal Theater $\,$



to watch a film everyone in

town was talking about, "East of Eden."



The movie started and as it continued, I became less and less interested. Without cowboys or Indians or a giant gila monster, it bored me mightily.



I stirred a bit during the scene where James Dean (as Cal Trask) and Julie Harris (Abra) are on the ferris wheel at the carnival in Salinas.

When Dean says to Harris "Abra, Abra," it was all I could do to keep from yelling out "Cadabra!" Remember, I'm just a kid, so cut me some slack.

Then one of the actors, I don't remember which, says "Look, you can see the lights from Castroville from here!" I kid you not, a big cheer went up from the audience: Alisal expressing its affection for its sister unicorporated town, Castroville.

I must confess that this, first youthful brush with John Steinbeck, was off-putting. Yeah, I get the whole Cain and Abel thing, one son apparently is favored while the other can't seem to get a break from his godly father.



On the other hand, the film introduced me to Harris, whom I came to admire with her performances in "Member of the Wedding" and my scariest movie experience of all time, "The Haunting." But, Steinbeck? Meh. I was more of a Mark Twain guy.

But then something happened: I read "East of Eden" the book.

I truly could not put it down. I was entranced. A couple of years ago I had pneumonia and thus had plenty of time on my hands and no place to go. I had purchased a copy of "East of Eden" a few years earlier, mostly because that's what someone born and bred in Salinas is supposed to do. It's like having the family Bible on the coffee table when the preacher comes by. I read the whole thing --- it's a pretty thick book --- cover to cover in two days.

"East of Eden" is a pot-boiler and contains in its pages the most villainous character ever penned in American literature in Cathy Ames, a woman described by Steinbeck as having a "malformed" soul. Her evil is so breathtaking, I won't spoil it for you if you haven't read to book.

If you saw either of the two movies of "East of Eden" and the portrayals of Cathy by Jo Van Fleet (1955) on film and Jane Seymour (1981) in a three-part mini-series on television --- but haven't read the book --- you have no idea how diabolical the character truly is. Nothing wrong with the casting. Van Fleet won the Oscar in 1956 for "East of Eden" as "Best Supporting Actress." Seymour took home a Golden Globe for Best Actress in a television film or mini-series.



Only, if only, I had the wherewithall and connections, I'd like to make two films. The first would be Franz Kafka's "In der Strafkolonie" ("In The Penal Colony") and then the uncut, unsanitized first half of Steinbeck's "East of Eden."

Well, someone has beaten me to the punch. From the mid-1950s, we're jetting to 2014 or maybe 2015 ... or thereabouts.


According to Mark Derming of Yahoo's "Movie Talk," sources in Hollywood tell him "Hunger Games" star Jennifer Lawrence is set to play Cathy Ames --- the young Cathy Ames in her whole satanic self --- in a new adaptation of "East of Eden." Universal will fund the new film after obtaining the rights from Steinbeck's estate. Gary Ross, who directed Lawrence in the first "Hunger Games" film will be the director. Ross has directed winners such as "Seabiscuit" and "Pleasantville."

One possible glitch is that Ross and Lawrence already have a full serving of projects on their plates. And, according to Deming, no screenwriter has been tapped to transpose Steinbeck's words into a script. (Put your hand down, Jim.) But, Deming wrote, Ross does much of the writing on his projects himself.

So, in the next couple of years, look for a new adaptation of "East of Eden" that's neither sappy, nor overwrought with angst.

But if it lives up to Steinbeck's writing, it won't be the kind of movie you take your 7- or 8-year-old to either.

In the meantime, read the book. I did, and Steinbeck and I are good buds now. Kafka and me, not so much nowadays. But that's another column.

Wishing all of you who do make it have a great time."





Deceased



Requests were received from 64 grads for information surrounding the death of Steve. Several 64 grads responded with similar but varying information. Perhaps someone can fill in the unknown details and the year of his death, which we know was not long after our high school years.

Below are the various remembrances pieced together.

Steve was either a passenger or a pilot of a small plane, and most likely a private plane. He and another passenger were returning from a business trip and he was possibly working for a produce company. The plane might have been coming in from Hollister, or coming back from Arizona, into the foothills west of Fremonts Peak. It crashed into a mountain in Salinas Valley in the evening, possibly Fremonts Peak, which was shrouded in heavy fog.

Here's a "Thank you" to that aged yellow wooden structure at 320 Lincoln Ave., the one that turns a vibrant 70 on Dec. 9.

That would be the Salinas Recreation Center, a place housing memories for thousands, young and old.

Long before it was the city's Rec Center, it was a USO — United Service Organization — center, the first of many of its type built during the World War II years.

It hosted soldiers in training at Fort Ord and other areas. It provided a place to go, to dance the foxtrot and jitterbug to the Big Band tunes of the day, to mingle with the locals.

Relaxation, in other words, in a time of a growing world war. Pearl Harbor was attacked two days prior to the center's opening. Many soldiers from the Salinas area were already deployed overseas.

The center provided a calm retreat, a place where troops could put aside the stresses and dangers of military life.

At war's end, there was no slowing down in terms of the center's service to the Salinas area.

At this moment, it's hosting a girls' volleyball league with 500 fifth- and sixth-graders.

Its basketball program starts in early January with up to 2,000 children in kindergarten through 12th grade involved.

Blood drives are held at the center. Craft shows are held there. It's headquarters for judges of the Kiddie Kapers Parade.

On and on.

Given all that, come Dec. 9, there ought to be a reunion or a cake or a plaque of appreciation.

Or all of the above.


